1. Piyush Goyal to lead India at WEF's Davos meeting



The annual meeting of the World Economic Forum began in Davos, Switzerland. The Indian delegation will be led by Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal during the five-day meeting. The event will help cement India's position as an important and relevant player in creating the global narrative, especially as it prepares to assume the G20 presidency next year.

key points:

- Several industry executives will also participate in the discussion of the World Economic Forum.
- The World Economic Forum will also serve as a forum to promote India as a desirable investment destination due to its strong economic growth and stable macroeconomic indicators.
- Mr. Goyal will also visit the United Kingdom on the 26th and 27th of this month to discuss progress in FTA negotiations with the UK government and businesses.
- The Prime Ministers of India and the United Kingdom agreed to hold a summit on Diwali 2022 to finalize the Free Trade Agreement between the two countries.

- 2. Anthony Albanese elected Prime Minister of Australia



The leader of Australia's Labor Party, Anthony Albanese, was sworn in as the country's new Prime Minister. After nine years, Albanese claimed victory in the election, ending his wait for power, with Anthony Albanese becoming the country's 31st prime minister. Outgoing Prime Minister Scott Morrison, who is leading the Liberal-National coalition, has conceded defeat. The 59-year-old new prime minister was sworn in at a brief ceremony at Government House in Canberra. Other members of his team taking office include Secretary of State Penny Wong, who will join the Albanians at the Quad summit, Treasurer Jim Chalmers and Finance Minister Katy Gallagher.

3. Odisha won the 12th Hockey India Senior Women's National Championship title



Odisha women's team won their maiden senior national gold medal by defeating Karnataka 2-0 in the final of the 12th Hockey India Senior Women's National Championship. Earlier, Hockey Jharkhand had defeated Hockey Haryana 3-2 in the third-fourth place match. The 12th Hockey India Senior Women's National Championship was held in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh.

However, solid defensive performances from both sides ensured that the match went into halftime with a 0–0 scoreline. Punam Barla (34') opened the scoring in the third quarter as Odisha took the lead. Ashim Kanchan Barla (59') sealed the game with a late goal as Odisha beat Karnataka 2-0 to claim the championship.

4. India's Inequality Status Report Released



Dr. Bibek Debroy, Chairman of the Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister, launched the Status of Inequality Report in India (EAC-PM). The Institute for Competitiveness wrote the research, which provides a comprehensive examination of the level and types of inequality in India. The study combines data on inequality in health, education, household characteristics and labor market sectors. Inequality in these areas, according to research, makes the population more vulnerable and leads to multidimensional poverty.

State Inequality Report Key Points: Significant progress has been made in strengthening the capacity of health infrastructure, with a special focus on rural areas. In 2005, there were a total of 1,72,608 health centers in India; There will be 1,85,505 by 2020.

• Between 2005 and 2020, states and union territories such as Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Chandigarh expanded the number of health centers (including sub-centres, primary health centers and community health centres).

According to the findings of NFHS-4 (2015-16) and NFHS-5 (2019-21), 58.6% of women underwent antenatal check-up in the first quarter of 2015-16, which increased to 70% in 2019-21. Within two

days after birth, 78.1% of mothers received postpartum care from a doctor or ancillary nurse, and 78.1% of infants received postpartum care. However, dietary deficiencies are associated with obesity, underweight and anemia (especially in children and adolescent girls). However, as the report indicates, nutritional deficiencies in terms of the prevalence of overweight, underweight and anemia (especially among children, adolescent girls and pregnant women) are major concerns that require urgent attention. In addition, inadequate health coverage, leading to out-of-pocket costs, has a direct impact on poverty rates.

Status of inequality report data:

- The report looks at five main factors that determine the nature and experience of inequality.
- It is divided into two parts: economic aspects and socio-economic manifestations.
- Income distribution and labor market dynamics, as well as health, education and household characteristics are among them.
- Current status in terms of infrastructural capacity, areas of concern, successes and failures and The end is devoted to explaining the effect on inequality.
- The research broadens the narrative on inequality by providing a thorough analysis that affects the country's diverse ecosystem of deprivations, with a direct impact on population well-being and overall development.
- It is a research that looks at how inequality affects society at the intersections of class, gender and geography.
- The report goes beyond wealth projections, providing only a partial view to emphasize income distribution forecasts for the years 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20.

- The report emphasizes that wealth concentration as a measure of inequality does not reveal changes in household purchasing power, and instead focuses on income distribution for the first time to explain capital movement .
- Extrapolation of the income data from PLFS 2019-20 revealed that a monthly salary of Rs 25,000 is already in the top 10% of total earnings, reflecting some degree of income discrepancy.
- The top 1% earn 6-7% of all income, while the top 10% get a third. Self-employed workers (45.78 per cent) had the largest percentage of self-employed workers in 2019-20, followed by regular paid workers (33.5 per cent), and casual workers (33.5 per cent) (20.71 per cent).
- The lowest income group also has the highest percentage of self-employed workers. The unemployment rate in the country is 4.8 percent (2019-20), while the worker population ratio is 46.8%.

BioRRAP will be used by all those seeking regulatory permission for biological research and development activity in the country. According to the minister, biotechnology has rapidly become a viable educational and career option for the Indian youth. There are currently over 2,700 biotech start-ups and over 2,500 biotech enterprises in operation in the country.

Dr Jitendra Singh while speaking after the launch of the portal said that India is on its way to become a global bio-manufacturing hub and will be among the top five countries of the world by 2025. He said the portal will allow stakeholders to view the approvals granted to a specific application using a unique BioRRAP ID. He lauded the unique gateway of DBT as a step towards making science and scientific research more accessible to Indians as well as ease of doing businesses

8. Indian teenager R Pragyanand defeated Magnus Carlsen for the second time in 2022



Indian GM Pragyananand registered his second win in 3 months over world champion Magnus Carlsen as he stunned the Norwegian in the Chessable Masters online rapid chess tournament. 16-year-old Pragyanand had defeated Magnus Carlsen for the first time in the online rapid chess tournament AirThings Masters in February.

Carlsen was second on the leaderboard after China's Wei Yi on the second day of the tournament. World's youngest Grand Master Abhimanyu Mishra is also a part of the 16-member tournament. Praggnanandhaa won with black pieces to end a 3-match winning run at Carlsen's AirThings Masters in just 19 moves in a Terrash variation game.

9. Red Bull's Max Verstappen Wins Spanish Grand Prix



Formula One world champion Max Verstappen won the Spanish Grand Prix at Red Bull to overtake Ferrari's Charles Leclerc, who retired with an engine failure while taking the lead at the Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya. Mexican Sergio Pérez finished second, 13 seconds behind, but with the consolation of a bonus point for the fastest lap, was asked to pass on to his teammate for a third consecutive win behind Imola and Miami.

Britain's George Russell finished third for a revived Mercedes and went wheel-to-wheel with Verstappen in a thrilling display of defensive driving as he struggled for second place behind Leclerc.

10. Fourth edition of Indo-Bangladesh Navy Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT) launched



The fourth edition of the Indian Navy-Bangladesh Navy Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT) began. The

patrolling exercise began in the northern Bay of Bengal and will continue from May 22 to 23. Both the units will conduct joint patrols along the International Maritime Boundary Line. The previous IN-BN CORPAT was conducted in October 2020.

Indian Navy's indigenous warships, INS Kora and INS Sumedha as well as Bangladesh Navy warships BNS Ali Haider and BNS Abu Ubaida will touch the water during the patrol. Maritime patrol aircraft of both the navies will also undertake joint patrols along the International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL) during the CORPAT. The regular operation of CORPATs has strengthened mutual understanding and increased interoperability between the two navies in countering international maritime threats at sea.
